Rare Collection of Irish Single Malts

Knappogue Castle Irish Whiskey named after a beautiful 15th century castle built in 1497 by Sean MacNamara. In 1920's, the castle was purchased and restored by Mark Edwin Andrews. In the 1960s, Andrews began buying casks of fine pot still whiskey from the top distilleries in Ireland. He aged and bottled them under the Knappogue Castle label. Knappogue 1951 is revered by connoisseurs as the oldest and rarest Irish whiskey. Triple distilled in copper pot stills in 1951. Made from malted barley and unmalted barley. Aged for 36 years in sherry casks (bottles in 1987).
